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#### **Delegations:**

Following the "Introductions" on page 2, we were provided education by Susan Dixon on the "**Drug and Alcohol District Focus Group**". Susan provided information on:

- The original 2003 Subcommittee with Trustees and Teachers (handout)
- Now the "Drug and Alcohol Pilot Project" includes the community, parents, PACs, DPAC, schools, students, teachers and trustees working together
- Average age of Crystal Meth exposure 11.6 years old in B.C.
- The Pilot Project includes Barrier, Logan Lake and Norkam Secondary's and their seven feeder schools
- Focus on SPC's goals of "social responsibility"
- Connie Buckle working on the "Directed Suspension Program" reduces the penalty by half. 78 students have participated so far in SD #73.
- The risk can be determined in preschool
- Grades 4-7 participate in the "Leaps and Bounds Program"
- Focus is
  - resilience in giving every student in the District education
  - make healthy students
  - it takes a community to raise a child
  - make partners in the community assets
